### THE JOY OF FORGIVENESS

Most often in life, different experiences bring us joy or sadness. During our life's journey we largely long for better and pleasant future, as we see it in the material development of the world. In modern times, there is also the growing global concern for peace and environmental protection. The fundamental concern for humanity is happiness which is based on inter-relationships in connection with material comforts. However, material possession and development cannot give us complete joy or happiness but good relationships amongst us, above all, our good relationship with God. Our human struggle should be to restore the broken relation-



ship with God and with each other, to address the issues of injustice, corporate greed, exploitation, violence, extremism, selfishness and immoral tendencies.

Today in the Gospel, Lord Jesus gave three parables to explain the spiritual joy of forgiveness. The parables of the lost sheep, ten drachmas and the prodigal son (Lk15:1-32), which show how God loves us even if we have moved away from Him in sin. He still invites us in our brokenness to come back to Him, provided we accept our sinfulness like the prodigal son. In each of the parables there is joy and happiness expressed at the end. This is to remind us that, in sin we live in sadness, doubts, worries and fear. As soon as we experience the mercy and forgiveness of God, we begin a new life of happiness. This explains the great importance to the Sacrament of Reconciliation/Penance which all of us need to receive regularly. The unhealthy relationships among people can bring resentment, anger, unfor-giveness, stress, depression, pain, despair, loneliness and substance abuse. Our Christian life invites us to make effort to break the chains of sin and build healthy relationships with God and each other by praying for each other like Moses in the first reading from the book of Exodus 32. We should avoid judg-ing and condemning others, but rather pray for them.

May this Sunday deepen our understanding of the mercy of God which should enable us to be merciful. *Fr. Pontíus Banáua*


