Honouring Sunday, a statement by the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales: The Bishops have issued a statement to encourage all the faithful to go for SUNDAY MASS. The following is an excerpt from the statement 'The Sunday Mass is the very heartbeat of the Church and of our personal life of faith. We gather on the "first day of the week," and devote ourselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers (Acts 2:42). The Eucharist sustains us and spurs us on, renewing our gratitude and our hope. When we say "Amen" to Christ in receiving his Body and Blood, we express the love of God which is deep within us, and at the end of Mass, when we are sent forth, we express our love for our neighbour, especially those in need. These two dimensions reveal the full meaning of our faith. We are gathered together and sent out, we pray and are fed, we worship and we adore; these are intrinsic to our lives as those baptised into Christ.' "PREPARE A WAY FOR THE LORD'

Preparation is one of the main actions one can undertake to realise any desirable outcome. During the Season of Advent, we are invited to prepare for the immediate and also the future, second coming of Jesus Christ which will be at the end of time. In order to prepare well, we need to renew and transform our attitudes, moods and feelings about events in the world and the people whom we encounter during our life's journey. We are called to enter deeply into our inner spiritual life, which is a place where we are able to hear the voice of the Holy Spirit directing us to do the will of God. To enable us to listen to the voice of Lord, we need to create some moments of silence, a quiet time to engage in prayer. We need to make an effort to enter into the desert of our life and this calls for silence and a detachment from any material distractions. This will also strengthen our ability to depend on God in all our life's activities.

Today, we celebrate the 2nd Sunday of Advent. The readings invite us to reflect on the need to seek for repentance and conversion. We are called to renew our relationships with God and with our fellow human beings. We should not be complacent in a world that experiences violence, hatred, prejudice, unbelief, injustice, wars, economic hardships, the desperate plight of refugees, the untold marine deaths of migrants, loneliness and the search for identity among our youth. In today's gospel, John the Baptist, called the Israelites to repentance and conversion when he proclaimed a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. John the Baptist said, "Prepare a way for the Lord. Make his paths straight." The Israelite community at that time had lost spiritual and moral direction and this required a change, based on spiritual life, in relation to the Covenant established with the Lord God under the leadership of Moses. John the Baptist was sent as precursor of Jesus Christ who would bring people back to God by spiritual. moral and social transformation. When we listen to the voice of the Lord and act upon it in our hearts then love, peace, justice and forgiveness will guide our lives. At the same time, we begin to make the path of the Lord straight in our hearts. The valleys of discouragement will be levelled and the hills and mountains of pride and selfishness will be flattened. Unfortunately today, we still experience some evils such as political oppression, social injustice and moral and spiritual confusion. The world continues to search for peace and love. As Christians, we are expected to carry the message of love and peace to the ends of the world, just as John the Baptist proclaimed it to the Israelite community. We are reminded to make a change of attitude and trust

in the Lord by accepting our limitations and sinfulness. The humility of John the Baptist should be our way of life. This will enable us to prepare well to meet the Lord this Christmas and at His second coming.
