HERE I AM LORD! I COME TO DO YOUR WILL.

Life is a journey containing two-way traffic, it is comprised of receiving and giving. Therefore, in our web of relationships, we need to speak and listen to what others have to say. Our relationships may be based upon family, business organisations, social affiliations, faith-groups or employer/employee connections. Within all these inter-connections, there should be harmony, respect and dialogue. If the principle of dialogue is ignored, the obvious results will be dissatisfaction, demotivation, squabbles, mistrust and possibly a total break down of the said relationships. Above all is the Divine and human relationship which is a very cordial one. The Lord invites us into a relationship with him and expects a response from us. All through the history of salvation, many figures of the Old Testament were called and they responded with faith and trust in the Lord including Abraham, Moses, Samuel and the prophets. They earned God's favour because of the faith and trust they had in following God's will and they were able to listen. As Christians, we are invited to do God's will, by saying 'Here I am Lord! I come to do your will.' It shows our love for God and dependence on Him, for life and life's needs.

As we celebrate the 2nd Sunday of Ordinary time, the readings invite us to reflect on our vocation to serve God. It calls for our total surrender to listen and obey God's law of love. In the first reading (1Sam3:3-10.19), Samuel was called by the Lord to a greater mission as guided by Eli. Samuel was able to respond appropriately because of the advice he received from Eli. Christian children should listen to their parents for the hope of a brighter future. Christian parents should encourage their children to love the ways of the Lord just as the priest Eli and the parents of Samuel. God has created us to serve him and our fellow human beings with utmost respect. Saint Paul mentions this in the second reading (1Cor6:13-15.17-20), when he says, 'Your body, you know, is the temple of the Holy Spirit, who is in you since you received him from God.' We should therefore, spend our lives glorifying God, and not engaging in reckless living. The Gospel(Jn1:35-42), underpins the message of Divine vocation, when John the Baptist intro-

duced Jesus to his disciples by saying, 'Look, there is the lamb of God.' Jesus later invited the two disciples of John to stay with him. The next day, when Andrew, told his brother Simon Peter, we have found the Messiah, they both followed Jesus. We are called from our different backgrounds to listen to the voice of God and we need other people to guide us so that we can recognise the Lord's voice. Our Christian faith and vocation are collaborative actions. It is a two-way system of growth where we are receiving and giving. May we learn to be more generous and welcoming.
