REPENT AND BELIEVE THE GOOD NEWS!

Repentance is the realisation of one's wrong doings. Upon experiencing this realisation, we then turn to God for mercy and forgiveness with a sincere heart and a determination to not sin again. Our Christian life is punctuated with uphill and downhill situations which call for a constant examination of conscience. During Lent, we are given an opportunity for a collective self-evaluation of our actions and attitudes. Today, we are confronted with spiritual and moral dilemmas. Do we truly follow God's law or are there for some human, fabricated philosophies and ideologies that we use to guide us in our day-to-day decision making? The period of Lent prepares us for the celebration of the central mystery of our salvation, the Paschal Mystery. At this time we are required to make in-depth examination of our conscience during the forty-day long spiritual warfare of Lent. We are also invited to renew our baptismal promises to serve God and love our neighbours, and to reject what does not confirm to God's will. The questions raised during this Lenten Season are, what are the issues that make us fail to meet the desirable standards of the Gospel of Christ? Why is there still escalating anger, misunderstanding, unforgiveness and discrimination within our families and communities? Our faith requires that the Lenten season is characterised by prayer, almsgiving, fasting, penance, self-control and charity. May we therefore, make firm resolutions during these forty days to do better each day and continue to do so thereafter.

As we celebrate the 1st Sunday of Lent, the readings remind us of the need for repentance so that we may attain eternal salvation. We live in a world that is very tempting and these temptations may be only overcome through prayer and self-control. In the Gospel (Mk1:12-15), Jesus was driven into the desert by the Spirit for forty days and was then tempted by Satan. Satan attempted to convince the Lord to bow to its whims but because of fasting and prayer the Lord Jesus was able to conquer it. We need prayers, and the grace of God, to overcome the temptations of our boldly desires such as greed, materialism, pride, jealousy, addiction and lack of self-control. May the waters of baptism that washed us clean for life in the Lord, remind us to be faithful. It

was so during the floods in Noah's time when he and the few faithful were saved. We should therefore deepen our faith according to what Saint Peter said, 'Christ himself, innocent though he was, died once for sins, died for the guilty, to lead us to God.' May this Lenten Season remind us of our waywardness and the Lord's loving mercy that he shows to forgive us when we are ready to change our direction and return to Him.
