

"ALTHOUGH HE WAS SON, HE LEARNT TO OBEY THROUGH SUFFERING"

Most often, when we are faced with any form of suffering, we tend to lose direction in life and also perhaps our trust in God. We can sometimes enter into despair and depression, especially if we are not prepared for such an eventuality. What matters so much in life's journey is to always be prepared and to pray to God for strength in the face of tribulations. Unless we have strong faith and obedience to the voice of God then any difficulties we encounter can break us down. Our modern society is faced with various problems in coping with sufferings and hardships in life. We need, therefore, to listen to the voice of God from within our inner being and he will redirect our thoughts to focus on faith and hope. Saint Paul mentioned that faith, hope and love matter in life (1Cor13:13). Our Lord Jesus instructed his disciples to be steadfast in moments of suffering. He said 'If anyone wants to be my follower, he must deny himself and take up his cross and follow me' (Matt16:24). A true follower of Jesus should expect suffering along the journey of faith. Our redemption has been made possible through the cross and His obedience to the heavenly Father. May we learn to listen more to the voice of the Lord during moments of suffering.

As we celebrate the 5th Sunday of Lent, the readings draw our attention to the Paschal Mystery; the passion, death and resurrection of the Lord. Today's Gospel (Jn12:20-30), anticipates the Lord's suffering, death and resurrection. Jesus said, 'Unless a wheat grain falls on the ground and dies, it remains only a single grain; but if it dies, it yields a rich harvest.' The death of Jesus brought forth a new order of human and Divine relationship. His death sealed a new and everlasting covenant for all who believe and who live by his instructions. The second reading mentions this clearly in the following excerpt. 'He learnt to obey through suffering; but having been made perfect, he became for all who obey him the source of eternal life'(Heb5:8-9). As all of us prepare to live eternally with the Lord at the end of time, let us try to get into the deeper understanding of God's love for us through Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection. As Christians, we should follow the example of self-sacrifice for others in the family, parish, Church and society. Just as the Lord gave himself up on the cross in obedience to the Father to save us, we should make sacrifices in order to help others. We should endeavour to transform our pride, anger, prejudice and selfishness into charity and generosity.
