'MAY THEY BE ONE LIKE US'

Unity is one of the core values of any society that wishes to promote the common good for every member. It is commonly said 'unity is strength'. Sometimes, it is said, 'United we stand and divided we fall.' Any human society, be it family, an economic group or political organization, should be united in a common interest for its survival and continuity. The evils of selfishness, greed, favoritism and pride should be put aside in order to realize this unity. We should focus on the common good for all and implement a balance of ideas and plans which can serve the needs of all people, including those who are considered insignificant within our societal settings. We should promote social justice in all respects, in order for everyone to live meaningful lives. Above all, as Christians, we should follow what our Lord Jesus has taught his disciples. We follow the prayer he offered to His heavenly Father saying, 'Holy Father, keep those you have given me true to your name, so that they may be one like us' (Jn17:11-19). Our Lord Jesus instructed his disciples to be united if the mission he left for them was to be accomplished. May we, as his followers, work together to build our faith and the practices of our sacramental commitment as celebrated daily in the Holy Eucharist. As we receive His Body daily in the Eucharist may we truly work for unity, love and truth. Let us witness the Risen Lord in our parish community, families and prayer groups by commitment and service to the parish. Our Catholic action should be real not just by words.

As we celebrate the 7th Sunday of Easter, the readings draw our attention to our Christian unity reflecting on the unity among the Three Persons of the Most Holy Trinity. The Lord Jesus prayed to His heavenly Father for unity among his disciples as a prerequisite of true discipleship. The disciples' unity would manifest as true witness and love. In today's first reading, Saint Peter asked the disciples to elect among them someone who would replace Judas Iscariot who had chosen to go to his proper place. This shows the sense of organization and unity among the disciples of the Lord. They were guided by prayer and the power of the Holy Spirit to elect Matthias. There was no politicking and they were entrusted to the guidance of the Holy Spirit. May

our families, communities and parishes be guided by prayer and Holy Spirit, and not by our human calculations and interests. As Saint John has emphasized, 'God is love, and anyone who lives in love lives in God.' It would be logical right that anyone who promotes division, gossip and favoritism does not live in God. May we therefore promote peace, love, truth and unity in our day-to-day living.
