PROPHETIC MESSAGE AND REJECTION!

The authentic prophetic messages remind us of the right way to follow the Divine law of love and respect for His creation. In most cases, due to the human faculty of free will, humanity is derailed from following the eternal law of love. The inconsistencies we can experience today are in contradiction to Divine love and are reflected in violence, wars, open disagreements, disunity, hatred, injustice, excessive materialism, consumerism and open scepticism. To find our way back to God we need strong prophetic messages to inform our conscience regarding the moral, spiritual and social aspects of our lives. It is not until we find the reason why we live, that we can begin to experience the joy of life amidst its challenges. Above all, as Christians, we are supposed to be prophetic in our actions and deeds so that we can demonstrate the law of love. It is worth noting that we shall face rejections in trying to follow the truth of life. Our Christian vocation and mission are not for the comfort and ease of life. The truth of the Gospel of Christ that we follow will place us on the wall of rejection to face insults just like Our Lord Jesus who was rejected and condemned to a shameful death on the cross. Many times, we say "The truth is bitter." Our Lord Jesus encouraged his disciples to be brave by saying "I have told you all this, so that in me you may have peace. In the world you will have suffering. But take courage! I have overcome the world" (Jn16:33).

As we celebrate the 14th Sunday, the readings remind us to be brave and courageous in living our Christian faith and to face rejection with hope. Just as the Lord encouraged prophet Ezekiel to address the rebellious Israelites with strong words not to fear. 'The Lord says this.' Whether they listen or not, this set of rebels shall know there is a prophet among them' (Ezk2:5). Our Christian practices should show our loyalty and commitment to living a holy life and rejecting sin in all its forms. The gospel gives a similar lesson of rejection and the determination of the Jesus to continue with his Divine mission, though he was despised by his home town people. The Lord said, "A prophet is only despised in his own country, among his own relations and his house" (Mk6:4). As commonly said, 'Familiarity brings contempt.' This can also be a danger for us today. When we freely and carelessly comment about our leaders of the Church, showing no respect, then we may fail to accept their prophetic mes-

sage to form our lives. We can live in spiritual aridity and obscurity if we become familiar with the leaders of faith, thinking that we know all about them. Let us try to develop trust and respect for our faith leaders and for everyone we encounter in life. May the Lord give us courage to face challenges of faith with hope.
