"CHRISTIANITY AND GENEROSITY!"

One of the core virtues of Christian faith is generosity. Right from the beginning of the infant Church, as reflected in the Acts of Apostles, everyone's needs were taken care of and they shared everything in common. 'The whole community of believers was one in heart and mind. No one claimed private ownership of any possessions, but rather they shared all things in common' (Acts 4:32). More recently in the 19th Century, Christians in Europe and America supported the young churches in Africa and Asia with their material donations and in turn they have now become the great hope for the growing population of Christians in the world. The Lord uses us as His instruments to expand His Kingdom of love, peace, justice and compassion. We are, therefore, called to cooperate with him by following the Gospel values of justice, peace and generosity. In our modern days the spirit of generosity is unfortunately dwindling due to the ideas of capitalism, secularism and materialism. As Christians, we are called to denounce these evils and adhere to the Gospel values of Christ.

As we celebrate the 17th Sunday, the theme of the Scriptural readings invites us to trust in God's providence and be generous. All that we possess is from God and we should take note of the less fortunate people in our society. In the first reading from the book of 2 Kings (2Kings4:42-44), a man brought the Prophet Elisha the first fruits of his harvest. This was an act of generosity and showed his gratitude to God. At the same time, the prophet used them to feed a hundred men who were hungry. The same lesson is echoed in the gospel (Jn6:1-15), when Jesus fed the five thousand people from five loaves and two fish which were offered by a small boy. The boy in the gospel and the man in the first reading are clear examples of generous people. We should therefore learn from their example and be generous in life. These events foretold of the Sacrament of the Eucharist which was instituted by the Lord Jesus during the Last Supper. Today, we continue to celebrate and receive daily. If we truly receive Holy Communion daily to imitate Christ's generosity, we should then respect, love and care for everyone regardless of origin and background. As we provide for the material needs for the poor, we will then satisfy the deeper hunger for justice, peace, love and compassion. May the Lord touch our hearts and minds to be generous in all aspects of our lives. We shall then fulfil and confirm what Saint Paul said when he asks us to live in unity and love. 'Do all you can to preserve the unity of the Spirit by the peace that binds you togeth-
