#### WHO DO PEOPLE SAY I AM?

Our identity is vital for any good relationship and validates the authenticity of an action. The true knowledge of someone's identity builds trust and confidence in every circumstance. In many cultural traditions, giving a name to someone draws the whole community and family together and it is usually a big event because it will determine one's future and destiny. Above all, as Christians, we take names when we receive the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation and during religious commitments. We are expected to live by the standards of the given or chosen names, because they identify or define our objectives in life. Getting to know someone's identity is the key and foundation of the establishment of a mutual relationship and understanding. When the Lord asked the disciples; 'Who do people say I am?' They gave different answers depending on what people said about him. As he wanted to know whether the disciples understood his identity, He then asked, 'Who do you say I am?' This question required a personal and reflective response. It was Peter who said; 'You are the Christ.' (Mk8:27,29-30). Therefore, it is not until we understand the identity of Christ, and what he wants of us, that we can truly begin to act correctly. There is a danger that we can rely on hearsay about the Lord's identity if we do not make any effort to deepen our personal relationship with him in prayer and have a commitment to do his will.

As we celebrate the 24<sup>th</sup> Sunday, the readings invite us to establish a personal and mutual relationship with the Lord by reflecting on his identity. When he asked the disciples, 'Who do people say I am?' He was drawing their attention and asking them not to confuse him with human and worldly expectations. This explains why he rebuked Peter who had responded well at first about his Divine identity. But when the Lord mentioned about his coming suffering and death, Peter could not understand. This could also be our challenge today, believing that following Christ means no problems. In this way we confuse his identity. He said, 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me'. We are invited to be practical in living our faith and this calls for sacrifices. As Saint James asks, 'Take the case, my brothers, of someone who has never done a single good act but claims that he has faith. Will that faith save him?' He added, 'Faith is like that: if good works do not go with it, it is quite dead' (Js2:14,17). May we, therefore, seek to find the identity of the Lord and act according to his teachings and life's examples.
