THIS IS MY SON, MY CHOSEN ONE; LISTEN TO HIM!

The transformation of our lives spiritually, and to pursue goodness or holiness in life's journey goes hand in hand with faith. Faith according to the teachings of the Church is 'a personal adherence of the whole man and woman to God who reveals himself. It involves an assent of the intellect and will to the self-revelation God has made through his deeds and words' (CCC 176). Considering this underpinning explanation of faith, therefore calls each one of us to make personal efforts to form our intellect with the grace of the Lord, to move beyond the material or physical experiences and place our whole being into the spiritual realm. This aspect of transcendence calls for formation, interest, desire, and meditation on the, mystery, majesty, or the glory of God aided by constant prayers. Many Biblical Patriarchs like Abraham, Isaac and Moses and the Saints in the history of the Church demonstrated this act of faith by their life examples. As Christians in the modern world, we are reminded to be transformed interiorly to believe and act according to the moral, social and spiritual values of the Gospel of Christ. Do we truly listen to the voice of Christ who has taught how to live in this world, or are we guided by our premeditated motives of life?

As we celebrate the 2nd Sunay of Lent, the readings invite us to meditate on the heavenly glories. The reflection and acknowledgement of heavenly realties form our attitudes and transform our personal and erroneous convictions. In the first reading (Gen15:5-12), when Abram was called, God pointed assured him of the bright future by pointing to the heavens and stars. The gaze at the stars gave Abram hope and transformed his attitude. As Christians today, we should gaze at Christ and his sacraments to get us to heaven, but in faith. The similar lesson is echoed in the gospel in the event of the transfiguration (Luke 9:28-36). When Jesus was praying, his appearance changed and clothes became dazzling white. It was an indication of the glory of God and heavenly manifestation. Undoubtedly, the event inculcated hope and confidence in the disciples who witnessed it. The presence of Moses, Elijah, and the voice from heaven, saying this is my Son, my Chosen one; listen to him' were all consoling and encouraging for the disciples. May we as Christians today, listen to the voice of Christ and focus on the loving presence of God in our day to day living. So, we can say 'the Lord is my light and my salvation.' **Fr Pontius Bandua AJ**
